Bernheim Forest contains an Arboretum, Nature Center, and Wildlife Refuge. It is located on 10,000 acres of Kentucky Knob Land.

The Falls of Ohio is an area of geological interest. Fossil evidence for many marine forms that once existed in the area are imprinted in the rocks. The shoreline of an ancient ocean is marked in the rocky ledges alongside the Ohio River.

The Louisville Zoo contains a Commissary and Hospital for animals that are viewed as models of modern zoological care. The Zoo contains an impressive number of animal species.

Churchill Downs is renowned as the home of the Kentucky Derby. A museum is located on the grounds, and one will be able to view the track and grandstand area.
